




# VIOLENT DEATHS BY RACE/ETHNICITY







## VIOLENT DEATHS BY AGE






# VIOLENT DEATHS BY GENDER





### DC VDRS



- The National Violent Death Reporting System (NVDRS) currently functions as a public health surveillance system generated by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).
- The NVDRS records the who, what, when, where, why and how of violent fatal incidents for all 50 states, Washington D.C. and Puerto Rico.
- Because the system centers on the incident instead of the victim, data such as multiple homicides within a 24-hour period, homicides followed by the suicide of the suspect, and circumstances precipitating violent deaths can be collected.
- In 2016, the District of Columbia's Department of Health and the District of Columbia's Office of the Chief Medical Examiner (DC OCME) were awarded CDC funds for a 5-year period to initiate the District of Columbia Violent Death Reporting System (DCVDRS) and began collecting data in 2017.
- The contribution of the District of Columbia Metropolitan Police
  Department (DC MPD) and DC Health as DCVDRS partnering agencies have
  been invaluable resources toward the efforts against DC violent deaths.
