

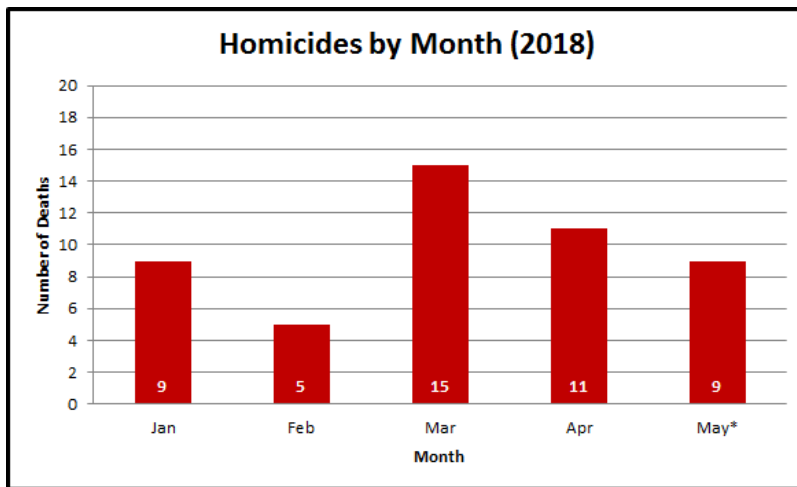

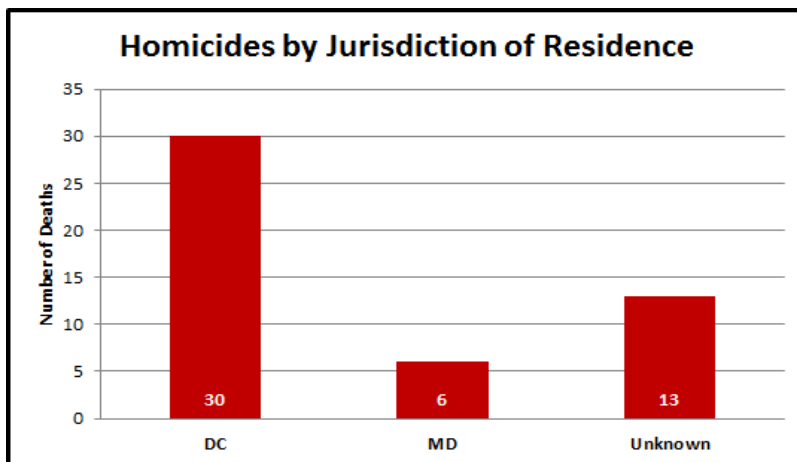
Homicides in the District of Columbia¹: January 1, 2018 to May 15, 2018²

Report Date: May 18, 2018

The District of Columbia Office of the Chief Medical Examiner (OCME) investigated a total of **49** homicides in the District from Jan. 1, 2018 through May 15, 2018*. This report includes all homicides that died in DC, including residents from other jurisdictions. The graphs below provide a breakdown of the homicides observed by OCME during the time period.
