Anthropology

The Anthropology Internship Program is designed to provide graduate level anthropology students exposure to a medical examiner's office and hands-on experience in forensic anthropological analyses. Under the guidance of the OCME staff anthropologist, the intern will participate in scene recovery and skeletal analysis as well as observe court room proceedings. He/she will participate in processing unidentified decedent cold cases. The intern is required to complete a small research project focused on a topic pertaining to forensic anthropology and will present the findings to the OCME staff at the end of the program. The internship is a 6-9 week summer program with flexible start and end dates. During the internship, the intern is expected to be available for 20-40 hours a week and to report to the office Monday thru Friday at 8:00 to attend the morning triage meeting. The intern may be asked to attend after hour scene recoveries. Individuals enrolled in an anthropology graduate program at an accredited university are eligible to apply.
